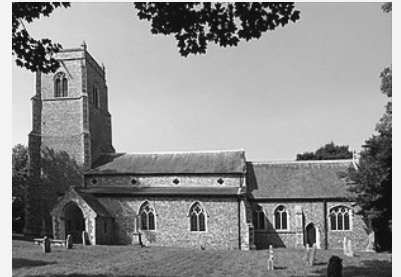
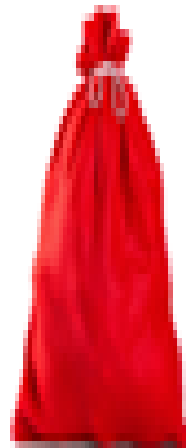

Neighbourhood Steering Group Update

The Neighbourhood Steering Group has made progress over the past few months. Here's a quick update on what we've been working on:

County Cllr Report

At the end of October I Chaired an all party meeting at County Hall where the subject everyone wanted to raise was roadworks. Not just in our area but all over the county the amount of roads and pavements being dug up seems to have be relentless. The two things that infuriate everyone is when the same area is dug up repeatedly and when there are emergency works (unplanned and often the most disruptive) but nothing seems to be happening. The answers from highways were mixed. They have limited powers because the utility companies basically have a legal right to dig up the road or pavement. Although a permit has to be granted for any work there are hardly any grounds on which they can be refused. The only real basis for refusal is how the work is coordinated to make sure that diversions can happen. The only other protection is that by law when the Council has completed roadworks itself apparently the same area should not be dug up for two years.

In practice nearly 95% of applications for permits are granted. There are meant to be incentives for companies to work

together, it seems obvious that that once a hole is dug it is used by more than one company. This doesn't happen in practice. Indeed, it only happened in just 0.2% of all roadworks in the past year. The Highways team does seek to chase utilities for work that takes too long, the figures show that about 10% of all works resulted in some kind of penalty and as reported in the EDP the Council netted about £478,000 in fines. However, the team of staff inspecting and chasing these things is small and the level of fines don't mean much to major utilities. The size of the team and number of inspections needs to increase when you consider that the amount of telecoms roadworks alone has doubled in recent years.

So what can be done? The message has gone out that there needs to be better communication of what/when works will happen, how long for and how to report it when work overruns. Highways need to take advantage of a new law and impose fines when reinstatement work isn't up to scratch. Emergency works need to be better inspected to make sure work is happening and Highways need to get utilities working better together. Unfortunately, given the scale of the issue it is unlikely that things will get noticeably better very quickly.

The County Council has just launched its budget consultation for next year. Unfortunately, it looks like the Council needs to save a further £44 million next year as well as increasing its share of Council tax. The three areas being consulted on are Council tax levels, whether to turn off some streetlights (not really an issue in Frettenham and none of the ones in Spixworth are County Council owned) and a cut to housing/homeless support. The last one is worrying, not least as it seems the wrong time to be doing this but also because I fear that every pound the County Council saves through this will cost another agency that much to put things right.

Changes to recycling centres take effect from 18th November with the need to book any visits to the tip in advance. I advise this through gritted teeth as I think if Mayton Wood had stayed open there wouldn't have been the queuing problems that the Council is now trying to solve.

Finally, there will be changes to Park and Ride services in 2025. First Bus will take over the contract running from the Airport site. However, the position re Sprowston is not clear. Although the Council insists that it remains part of the park and ride service it just seems that it will become a normal stopping point for the local bus services in that area rather than a park and ride as we know it.

He didn't even register the young woman until he had half-closed the door. He saw the weariness in her eyes at the same time as the frustrated tears in her husband's. Then he realised that the man had been saying his wife's waters had broken.

He was a father himself, and he realised that he couldn't turn them away. He caught up a couple of lamps and a flask of oil before leading them around to the back. He was genuinely sorry as he admitted that all he had for them was a shelter for the animals, yet at the same time, he knew they would take it. They were desperate.

The innkeeper asked his wife to go and help, then sent round clean linen and water as well as a pot of stew, bowls and bread. It was much later, after everyone was asleep and the dough for the morning was made and proving that he went around. His wife had told him that all had gone well. She said they had walked from Galilee, several days with a baby due any moment.

He had seen plenty of babies, but nothing prepared him for what he saw that night. When he arrived the shelter was crowded. The local shepherds were down from the hills, wide-eyed with tales of angels and glory. Nathan took him aside and told him with terrifying certainty that this child was the Promised One, the Messiah that King David had heralded. Even more, he was the One that the prophet Isaiah had written of. The child who would be God himself, Emmanuel, come to live with his people.

The innkeeper stepped inside, wonder and doubt battling in his heart. Might it be that there was hope? That the old stories were true? That God would come for his people, find them again, bring light into their darkness?

As the innkeeper took the child and looked down, he gazed into the face of his Lord. His eyes met those of a tiny infant and of the eternal God. He simply wept. Nothing would ever be the same again. This is Christmas.

This is Christmas. Our God came for us. Into the darkness, the poverty, the tiredness and the desperation; he came. He came to give us light, hope, peace, joy, glory. He came to find us and to save us. He came because he loves us and wanted to bring us home. He came. This is Christmas.

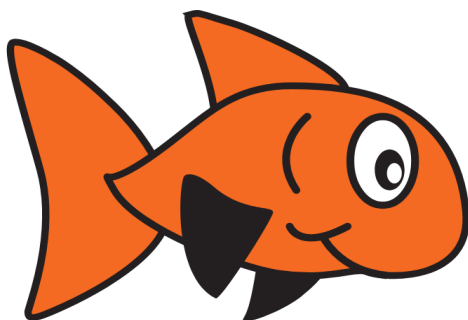

NORTONS DAIRY



Following a long, relatively mild and dry autumn, the weather has now turned and we are feeling that winter chill! Our milking herd is back in the barns full-time, and it is only our group of 'dry' cows (those that are not yet in the milking herd and/or are pregnant) that remain outside. You can tell the weather is changing as these girls that are staying outside have grown a thicker and shaggier winter coat to keep themselves warm. At present, this group is grazing the fields that immediately surround Church Farm but they will be moving over to some winter grazing elsewhere on the farm in the coming weeks. This winter grazing is a combination of rough pasture and a fodder crop.

Our new milking parlour is currently being installed with big changes happening all the time. The new stall work is in place and the pipes, tubing and various pumps are starting to be put into place. The walls now have a hygienic cladding on them and the floor has a thick rubber mat to provide both grip and comfort for the girls as they milk. The next steps are to build a new plant room to house all the controls and tanks needed for the parlour.

Our soft cheese production is ramping up for Christmas as the seasonal flavour combination of Orange and Cranberry has been released for another year. Our doorstep customers have all received, or will very soon be receiving, their Christmas order forms for additional dairy products. However, you do not need to be an existing customer to place an order to collect from the farm so please do get in touch if you would like anything! We will have soft cheeses, cheese selection boxes and gift boxes as well as our milk, cream and yogurt all available to order for Christmas.

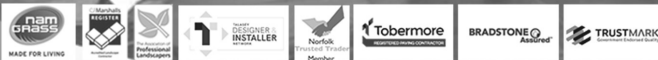

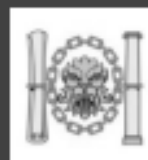
