PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Neighbourhood Plan: At the Annual Parish Meeting on 10th May 2024, there was a presentation by Councillors giving more information about the formation of a Neighbourhood Plan. Display boards were used and included QR codes linking to useful websites. These will remain on display in the village hall, so if you are attending any groups or sessions there, over the next few weeks, please do take a look. The working group is also planning to hold an information session on Friday 14th June 2024 at 6.30pm for any residents wishing to find out more or to chat with a Parish Councillor. This is a significant piece of work which can only be taken forward with sufficient help, so please do come along to find out more and let us know what you think. If you have any specific skills or experience which may be useful or if you have any questions, you can also contact the Clerk.



Community Group: The next litter pick by the Community Group is being held in June. Please keep an eye on the council website: www.frettenhamparishcouncil.org.uk for more information. The Council are always looking to welcome new volunteers to join our Community Group. Other projects are being considered and more information will be shared via the Council website when available. If you have any questions or wish to be kept up to date with future activities, please contact the Clerk.

Defibrillators: During recent checks a fault was discovered on the defibrillator at the Rose and Crown Pub. Attempts to have the device serviced revealed that it is now a discontinued model but as it was still under warranty an up-to-date replacement will be issued at no cost to the Council and we are awaiting delivery which may take up to 6-weeks. Please note that whilst this exchange is taking place the defibrillator will be out of action. The primary school defibrillator is unfortunately out of order too. The Council is working to resolve this as soon as possible but as this unit is out of warranty, it will need to be replaced if it is not possible to get it back online. The Council will look to fund this using available grants, if necessary.

Joining the Council: We do still have a vacancy for co-option to the Council, so if you are interested in finding out more, please contact the Clerk in the first instance.

Allotments: The Council have a waiting list running for any residents who wish to rent an allotment plot. If you would like to be added to the list, please contact the Clerk.

Frettenham Mobile Post Office Service: This service takes place on Wednesday mornings from 10.30 to 11.30. The Post Office van parks in the Village Hall car park. A wide range of services will be available. Customers can still collect benefits in cash using the everyday banking services or Post Office card account.

Mobile Library:

Norfolk County Council's mobile library visits the village every 4 weeks, stopping on Buxton Road, Hill Farm (Croswick) and Post Office Road/Well Green.

I have enjoyed researching topics and sharing my many memories of Frettenham and surrounding villages, along with things from the village archives. Having lived in Crostwick and Frettenham all of my life I have seen many changes and have tried to cover different topics for each newsletter and to give you a flavour of what life in the village was like and how much has changed. I am now finding it increasingly difficult to come up with new ideas.

It would be great if someone else would be prepared to volunteer to take over this role. I am happy to pass on the information and items I have for the village archives which can be a good starting point for future topics. It is just one small article every three months.

As my final article I am sharing a number of old postcards of nearby Horstead.



This Image of Horstead Street shows the Recruiting Sargent, whilst the building hasn't changed, the frontage has. A sign on the wall next to the pub sign offers 'good stabling'!



This image of Horstead Street is just beyond the pub and looks very different today. Not least the total lack of vehicles other than a horse and cart!



Central Garage is still in the same spot as it was but many of the buildings around it have changed significantly.

Only one of the postcards was actually mailed and the post card was sent to a Miss Jones of Bull Close Road in Norwich and it cost a halfpenny to send.

BECK FARM DIARY

Having read Geoff's recollection of Frettenham Festivals, in the archive section of our last newsletter, I thought I would give my recollection of the Frettenham Fetes which took place on the back meadow at Church Farm, circa 1955–1960.

Before the weekend of the fete, my Father would tell my brother Bob, to get two of the workforce to start preparing for the fete. One of the first jobs was tidying the roadway that ran past our house and the cow yard, and led to the meadow, where an area big enough for the fete would have to be cleared of cow pats! The gateway would have a pole secured to each gatepost, with bunting tied across the top, to create a "grand entrance". A gentleman's toilet was constructed with tin corrugated sheets and wooden posts along the hedgerow beyond the fete area. The ladies were signposted back to Church Farm house, which enjoyed the luxury of a relatively recently installed flushing toilet, adjoining the house. In part of a farm building, next to the meadow, two bays used regularly by the cricket team, for tea and shelter if needed, were prepared for the same purpose on Fete day. Most of the games and competitions, such as 'bowling for the pig', darts, hoopla and coconut shy, had timber constructions which had been stored at the farm. Local people would volunteer to run these games and would also help farm staff to find and often mend what was needed to make them work. I can remember a large piece of hardboard with numbered squares painted on, which was always kept in the farmhouse garage, and could be seen every time on returning from a car journey. This was for the tombola stall, and small gifts like chocolate bars, soft drinks in bottles, and sweets, were put in all the squares. I think it cost 6d (6 pennies) to pick a ticket from a tin. A win was guaranteed.

Some years a stage was needed and this was built by farm staff using what they could find on the farm; I think old wheels were used to support floor sections which were bolted together for stability. A dancing troupe from Norwich entertained one year. A "Miss Frettenham" competition took place another. I believe the photo attached is of the judges of this competition giving their verdict to my Father, Jack, who is talking to Mrs Hendrie here.

Also visible in the photo is the marquee, in the background. Begged or borrowed for fete day, erected and dismantled by the strongest volunteers, this 'big tent' had sandwiches and cakes, and soft drinks for sale, as well as other small stalls, and could be a shelter from rain or sun!

As can be seen from the photo, a good number of people attended and 'dressed up' for the occasion! Everything for the Fete was donated and help given voluntarily. Crates of bottled soft drinks were on 'sale or return'. Other items were sold to reasonable offers.

When all the bags of coins had been counted by my mother on the following day, my father and her would drive to the Bank to deposit the money raised. These were early days on the way to achieving the Village Hall and Playing Field we have today.

Of course the meadow had to be cleared up on Monday morning by some of the farm workers, after the cattle had been milked and fed!

My daughter was about three years old and had always loved the sea. As a baby we had to keep an eye on her near water as she would crawl towards it with glee! It was a really hot day at Cromer and she said, ‘daddy, take me far out’. I picked her up and walked out into the sea until the gentle waves were lapping my chin. She had her arms wrapped around my neck, her face by mine as we watched the sunlight glint and spin off the waves before us.

I am like her. I have always loved the sea. I remember going on holiday to France as a teenager, standing as far forward on the ferry as I could, enjoying the wind and spray and sun. For years the first thing that came into my mind whenever I came to the seaside were the first two lines of a poem I had learnt at school:

‘Take me down to the seas again, to the lonely sea and the sky,
And all I ask is a tall ship and a star to steer her by.’ (from *Sea Fever* by John Masefield)

There is a sense of freedom, of immensity, of strangeness to the ocean. To stand on the shore is to gain perspective on our own smallness in the face of such vastness. Yet not in a way that crushes us but instead that causes our worries and fears to flee away like the blown spray. It is a blessing to live so close to the sea.

Since I became a follower of Jesus as a young man, my love of the waters has deepened. The Bible has an ambivalent attitude to the deeps of the oceans. They are part of the Lord’s good creation but they also stand as a picture of power and danger. The wild storms of the deep ocean are a picture of the tumult of the human heart and of the violence of our warfare and rebellion against God.

This ambivalence will one day be resolved, however, in the vast seas of the new creation – that coming age which Jesus will one day begin when he returns from heaven. These seas are calm and fresh, their water to be drunk and their peaceful waves to be swum, surfed and sailed. But that is not the final word the Bible has on the seas. For then they will still be a picture, but now of something far greater:

‘The earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.’ (from the Bible, Habakkuk chapter 2, verse 14).

In my mind Masefield has given way to Habakkuk, and the lines from *Sea Fever* come into my mind now second, after this great prophecy. This Summer many of us will enjoy sun-soaked splashing, dripping ice-creams, sandy chips and evening strolls on the beaches and in the seas of Norfolk. As you look out at the glinting and glimmering sun jumping from wave to wave,

maybe take time to pray. For there is a God and his glory will cover the earth as the waters cover the sea. His name is Jesus and all the warmth, light, joy, hope, peace and wonder flows from him.

This may seem like silly talk to you, or it may stir a longing in your heart. Our church is made up of people who have messy, confused, storm-tossed lives and have found the kindness, care and forgiveness of Jesus utterly transforming. If you would like to talk and think more about this God who made you, then we would love to help any way we can.

Children are a very welcome part of our Sunday meetings and we provide supper for them when the adults are having a cup of tea and biscuits.

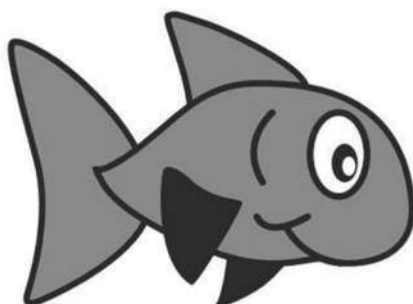

NORTONS DAIRY



It's a lovely time of year on the farm, with the cows now all out on the meadows and the hedges and verges bounding into life. Our dairy herd is grazing by day with access to the barns overnight should they choose. Our girls graze the grass in sections which are swapped every 8 hours. This encourages them to eat the grass right down to the ground, where all the nutrients are, and allows a fresh flush of grass to take its place. With warmer days and plenty of moisture, the meadows are growing faster than the cows can graze it and so we have started cutting for grass silage which will be stored as feed for next winter.

We have been working on plans to update and improve our milking systems and this summer we are installing a new milking set up. The aims for this new setup are to allow us to grow the size of our milking herd, which currently sits at around 55-60 cows, while also improving our overall efficiency in terms of reducing our energy consumption and wastage. One clever way that sustainability is being built into our new system is that the heat generated by cooling our milk down in the bulk tanks will be recycled and used to provide hot water for the cleaning cycles. Another very simple change is that our hot and cold water, required for milking, will be gravity-fed rather than pumped which further reduces the amount of energy required.

As we are a closed herd, meaning that no animals are brought onto the farm and greatly reducing the risk of disease, the process of growing the herd will take time. This is a process we have already started, and the next generation of the herd can be seen grazing on the field across from the church so be sure to say hello as you're walking around the village.


